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29th GIFF & 11th GDM: Release of the 2023 program

The full program for the forthcoming edition of the Geneva International Film Festival (GIFF, November 3 – 12) has been released. Reflecting the creative vibrancy of the contemporary audiovisual industry, and changes in technology, GIFF is presenting a convergent program (films, series and immersive experiences) that is unique within Switzerland, formed of 110 works (53 films, 27 series, 28 immersive experiences and 2 installations) including 17 world, 7 international, 2 European and 64 Swiss premieres. The honorific awards, this year bestowed on Jean-Michel Jarre (Film & Beyond Award), the Kourtrajmé collective (Geneva Award by Edmond de Rothschild) and Marguerite Kudelski (Tales of Swiss Innovation), clearly demonstrate the Festival's desire to break down barriers and democratize the audiovisual industry. Its professional arm, the Geneva Digital Market (GDM, November 6 – 10), offers a high-caliber immersion into the issues and challenges facing the audiovisual sector, focusing mainly on the use of artificial intelligences, an analysis of new applications, and the issues surrounding feminism in digital creation.

INTERVIEW WITH ANAÏS EMERY, EXECUTIVE AND ARTISTIC DIRECTOR OF GIFF

The 2023 edition is the third under your directorship. Is this a defining stage for the Festival?

Anaïs Emery: This third edition has given me the opportunity to refine the role of GIFF and the GDM as places to reflect on and experiment with the potential of audiovisual media. This approach requires constant research and an ability to adapt easily to change. This latest edition of the GIFF offers content and encounters which illustrate the scope of contemporary audiovisual whilst showcasing important movements in Swiss cultural history. This program is very close to my heart. It took a great deal of work, research and viewings. For me, the 2023 edition also clearly sets out the key focus of GIFF and the direction of its future developments.

Convergent competition: Future is Sensible

A convergent competitive section dedicated to social, ecological, and technological foresight, featuring series, films and immersive experiences that question ethical choices and their impact on the future. The Future Is Sensible Award, endowed with a cash prize in association with the Migros Culture Percentage, is given by a Jury of three international personalities active in the audiovisual field and creative industries – **Nora Khan** (author, curator, US), **Giovanna Fossati** (professor, Amsterdam University, NL), **Keith Stuart** (journalist, Guardian, GB) – to a production that stands out for its humanism and ethical dimension, among a dozen international projects.

Three inclusive and vibrant honorific awards

GIFF will honor visions and talents which are striving for an innovative, diverse and inclusive future for audiovisual production. For the first time in its history, the **Geneva Award by Edmond de Rothschild** will celebrate a collective, **Kourtrajmé**, in recognition of this group of artists' exceptional contribution both to the arts and to education through their school (more info). The **Film & Beyond Award** will go to the icon of electronic music **Jean-Michel Jarre** on the occasion of the international premiere of his latest immersive experience, co-created with the Taiwanese artist Hsin-Chien Huang (more info). Lastly, **Tales of Swiss Innovation** will pay tribute to the iconic Swiss invention, the Nagra, in the presence of **Marguerite Kudelski** who will take us back to the golden age of this recorder which revolutionized the capture of sound for radio and cinema (see below).

A first series of unmissable guests

Around hundred prestigious guests will be joining us, such as Matteo Garrone (*Io Capitano*) accompanied by his two leads Seydou Sarr (Best Newcomer at Venice 2023) and Moustapha Fall, Sofie Gråbøl (*Prisoner*), Ladj Ly alongside his colleagues from the Kourtrajmé collective Kim Chapiron, Romain Gavras, Toumani Sangaré, Nabil Zerfa and Yassine Lassar Ramdani (Geneva Award by Edmond de Rothschild), Arnaud des Pallières (*Captives*), Ramata-Toulaye Sy (*Banel & Adama*), Mehdi Fikri (*Avant que les flammes ne s'éteignent*), Delphine Lehericey joined by Pitch Comment and Camille Rebetez (*Les indociles*), Elise Girard (*Sidonie au Japon*), Fabienne Giezendanner (*Bloom*), David Constantin (*Tschugger*), Iris Brey (*Split*), Darren Emerson (*In Pursuit of Repetitive Beats*) and the livestreamers FibreTigre and SerialThinker. Tales of Swiss Innovation: Switzerland, Sound and the Nagra by Marguerite Kudelski

After the OIL Productions collective and the EPFL researcher, Sabine Süsstrunk, this year, GIFF celebrates the Swiss company Kudelski and its enduring presence within the global audiovisual industry, in particular its iconic invention the **Nagra**, a family of magnetic tape sound recorders. Introduced to the market in 1951 by Stéphane Kudelski, these devices revolutionized sound recording for film, television, radio and elsewhere, thanks to their portability and efficiency – not only technically and





practically, but also artistically. **Marguerite Kudelski**, Stefan's daughter and currently a member of Kudelski-Nagra's Board of Directors, will be present at GIFF to explore the history of Nagra in a Masterclass discussion with researchers from the University of Lausanne.

Series to binge at home

Since 2022, GIFF has been giving the public the opportunity to watch selected series in the competitive sections, and for some exclusive previews, directly from their homes! After the first episodes are shown on the big screen, viewers will receive a link which will enable them to access the entire season via the Festival's streaming platform. This innovative offer provides access to complete series from across the globe.

Geneva Digital Market

A unique event dedicated to Swiss audiovisual innovation, the Geneva Digital Market (GDM) returns on November 6 – 10. This 11th edition features a cycle of conferences shining a much-needed spotlight on the current issues facing audiovisual creation and a market of digital works from across Europe, bringing together more than 350 professionals from the creative industries in this hybrid platform. The meetings and discussions will be broadcast on Radio Télévision Suisse (RTS). The full program for the GDM is now online!
